## **Jay McConville Outraises Opponent with Over \$62,000 in September**

McConville also reports more in-district contributions and donors

MOUNT VERNON - Community leader and decorated veteran Jay McConville announced that his campaign raised over \$62,000 in the month of September, outraising his opponent. McConville is running for the House of Delegates in the 44th District in a campaign GOPAC recently called one of the "most winnable" races in Northern Virginia. McConville previously outraised ten-year incumbent Del. Kris Amundson (D-44) in the first two months of the campaign. Amundson dropped out of the race a few weeks later.

McConville reported \$62,216.19 raised from 230 donors from September 1st through September 30th, over \$13,000 more than his opponent. Over 84% of the individual donations received by the campaign in September were \$200 or less.

More than four out of five individual donors to McConville's campaign in September were residents of the 44th District. Since the campaign began in April, McConville has raised nearly \$179,000; the majority of that money and more than two-thirds of donors, over 300 in total, are from the 44th District.

"I've been so blessed to have the support and confidence of so many Mt. Vernon residents," Jay McConville said. "Everywhere I go, whether knocking on doors, meeting with local business owners, or watching football games with other local high school parents, the voters of the 44th District are responding to my message of putting people above politics."

McConville's campaign manager Stephen Spiker noted that Jay has received more money from more donors inside the 44th than Jay's opponent and said that is consistent with the response the campaign has received on the ground. "Voters here understand that Jay McConville is the only candidate in this race who has achieved real results for Mt. Vernon, and that he will be a Delegate they can trust to always do what is best for everyone in our community," Spiker said.
